WINDSOR TOWN HALL

Start your tour at Town Hall 301 Walnut. Check in at the front desk and climb the old wooden staircases up to the third floor converted old auditorium. Be sure to read the photo captions portraying the history of this Park School building which was restored after the Windsor 2008 tornado.



MAIN COMMUNITY PARK

Walk out the back south entrance to Windsor's first Park where you can play pickle ball, zip line on the NW playground equipment, sit in the old bandstand and visualize the concerts held there when folks drove their horse and buggies in from Elm and Locust Streets to sit and listen to the music.

ST ALBAN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH

Listen to the church bells that chime and play music at the top of every hour. Check out Windsor's historical churches on the Town of Windsor website www.windsorgov.com. The converted old German Russian church on the east side of Main Park is delightful. Bethel Lutheran on 4th and Walnut plays chimes in memory of Henry Kurtz who lost his life in WWII. In addition, enjoy the charming historic old homes as you stroll pass the Methodist Church which is on the national register, then peak around the corner to see Saint Albans Episcopal Church on 6th Street.

1908 WINDSOR HOSPITAL

Time to head towards Main Street and Windsor Lake. Note the 1908 Hospital on 5th Street and the old telephone building with mural at Natural Therapyz. Rent a bike at Spokes to ride around Windsor Lake Trail or stop to shop and eat downtown. Head north on 5th Street and check out the Old City Hall Arts and Heritage Center exhibits. Read the signage along the way at Boardwalk Park. Stop in the Train Depot to line up a tour of the one room school and teacherage, Four Square house, beet shanty, and prayer meeting house.



WINDSOR SEVERANCE FIRE MUSEUM

West of the depot you'll find the Windsor Severance Firehouse Museum. If weather permits rent a paddle boat at Windsor Lake or walk the trail to view the pelicans that roost on the logs. After your long walk/bike ride stop in at the historic Windsor Mill and enjoy a beverage/meal. If you want to catch the Poudre Bike Trail, head south on 3rd Street. The trail will take you east as far as Island Grove Park in Greeley, or west along the Poudre River to Larimer County. If you are tired, stroll over to the Clearview Library and check out a book and snuggle in front of the fireplace. The library extends complimentary WiFi in their tech corner.
